

2016 Federal election campaign report

Labor reduced the Conservatives to only a 1 seat majority in the House of Representatives in the 2016 Federal election. The loss of 17 Coalition MPs and Senators defeated the plan to pass the anti union ABCC bill in a joint sitting of Parliament, which was the entire point of the double dissolution election.

Every Vote Counts

Australia House in London was again the largest polling station in the Federal election with 15 463 votes cast at the London Overseas Polling station between June 20th and July 1st. Over 70,000 votes were caste at the 99 overseas voting locations.

The importance of the Overseas Vote in close contests was again demonstrated in the seat of Herbert this election where former ALP Abroad secretary Steph Naunton was campaign manager. On the final day of the counting Labor finished in front by 8 after being behind by 12 votes with only 60 Overseas votes left to count which they broke 40 20 to Labor. (The recount increased Labor's margin to 39 after 31 Labor votes were found to have been counted as One Nation votes).

ALP Abroad is a voluntary organisation that works to ensure that overseas Australians vote Labor. While we work closely with the ALP and receive some support, our success is due to the efforts of volunteers which in 2016 was again outstanding.
